

# A Fish for Jesus

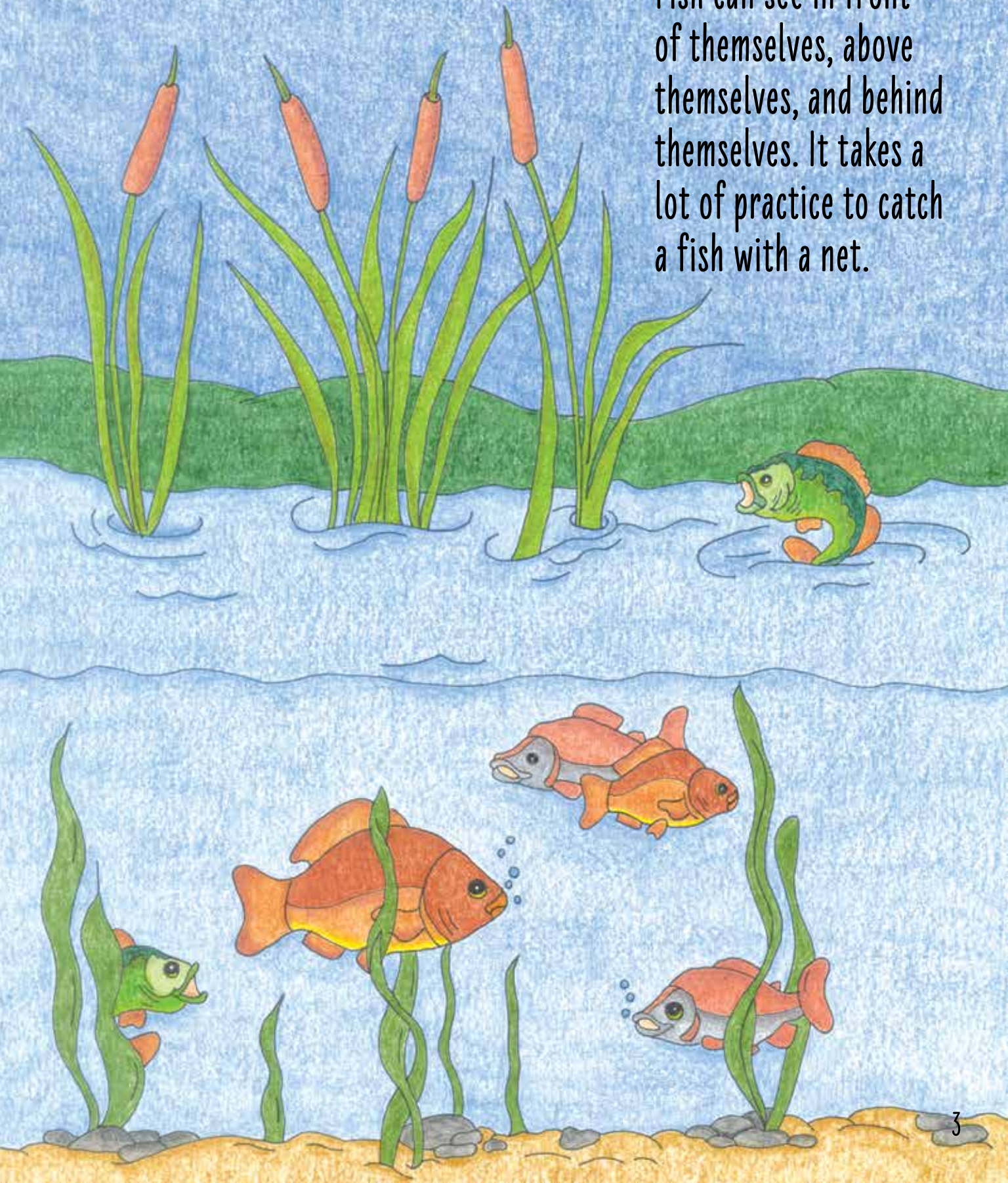

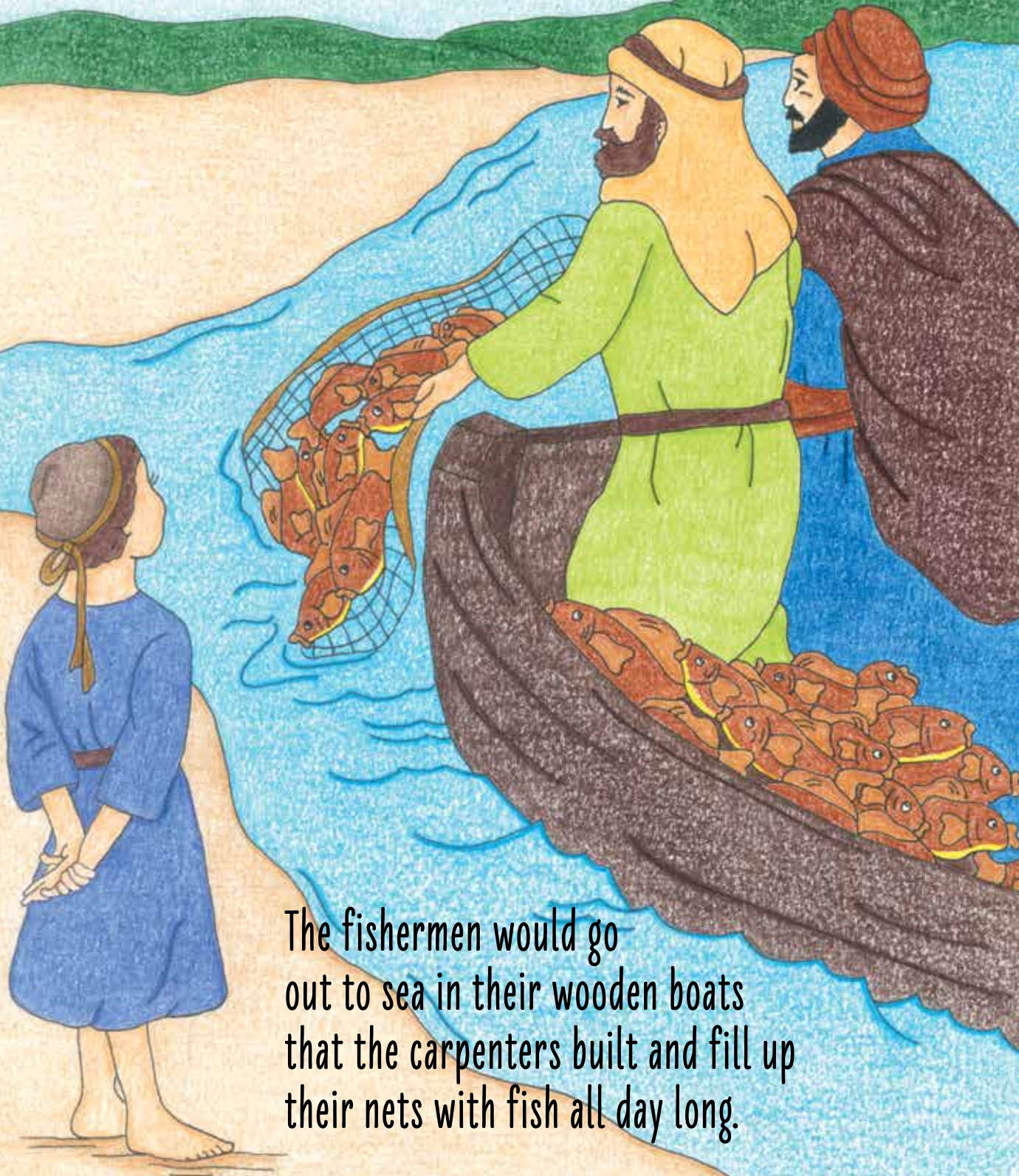


Have you ever tried to catch a fish with a net?

Fish can see in front of themselves, above themselves, and behind themselves. It takes a lot of practice to catch a fish with a net.

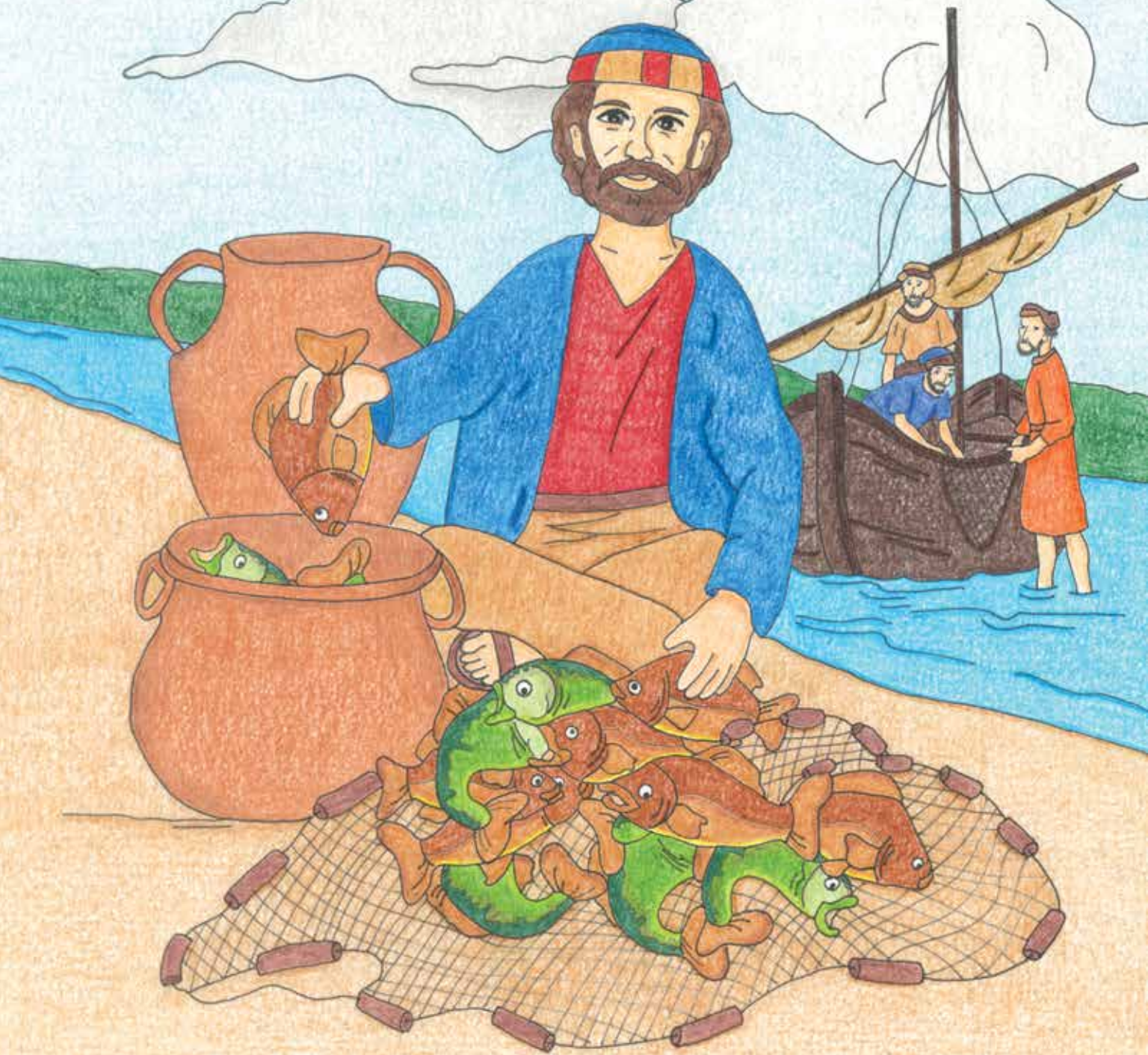


When Jesus was a little boy, some grown-ups were fishermen, and others were carpenters.



The fishermen would go out to sea in their wooden boats that the carpenters built and fill up their nets with fish all day long.

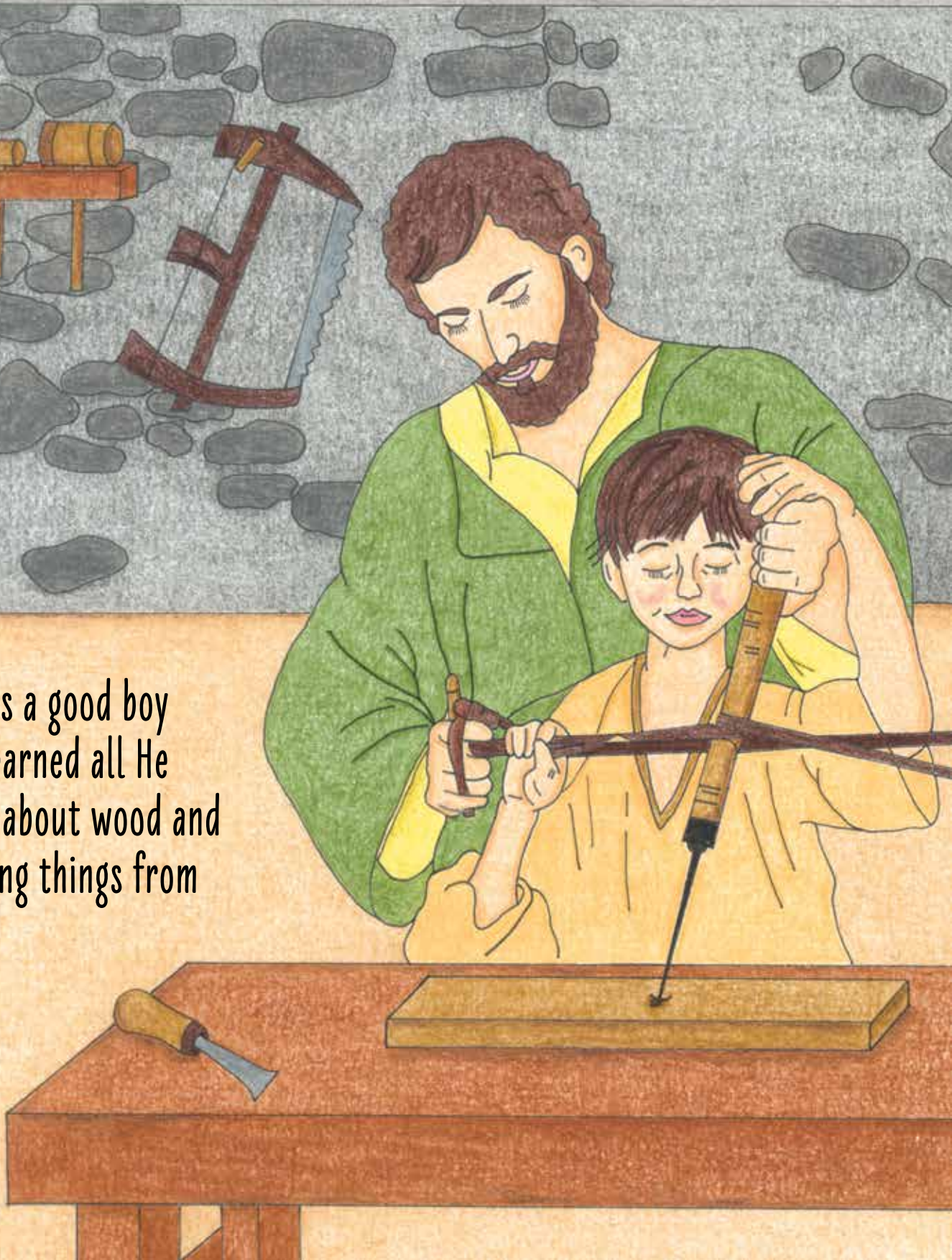
It was hard work and very tiring.
